The Classic Wallabies’ Indigenous Exchange (CWIE) program is committed to promoting and strengthening the positive relationship between Indigenous Australians and the Wallabies’ alumni.

We, as the flag bearer of the CWIE programs around the world, have developed guidelines for CWIE participants to assist them with expectations of appropriate behaviour while they are abroad as representatives of the program.

These guidelines are based on similar Codes of Conduct that were in place for Wallabies’ touring teams over the past 100 years.

These guidelines have been developed to maintain the elements of enjoyment and satisfaction in the “touring” experience.

At all times, remember that you are representing your families, your people, and your country, under the title of the CWIE program.

Respect local culture, lore and customs.

Adhere to the responsible consumption of alcohol while on tour; and understand that there will be a zero tolerance to illicit drug use.

Always remain humble and proud of your own talents, and celebrate and promote the talents of those travelling with you. As we know with our time playing for the Wallabies, this is the key ingredient to success, where the team becomes greater than the sum of the parts.
